Papyrus is a Web 2.0 design for a personalized library interface that increases the usage of library content by making library content easier to access and more relevant.

Feeds, Tags & Friends

A single, easy to use interface featuring feeds, tags & friends are familiar to Web 2.0 users and allow them to have a personal, customized library content feed that they can quickly filter.

Course Awareness

Using the MCommunity identity management system, Papyrus automatically knows user course affiliations, making their library content feed relevant and easy to filter.

MLibrary Tool Integration

Papyrus integrates with existing MLibrary tools by allowing users to add content from the various tools. Papyrus also acts as a consolidated system where library content is accessed through MLibrary tools.

Import From Across The Web

Through the use of browser extensions, bookmarklets and cloud computing tools, users are able to take anything they find out on the web and share it with others as well as see if the library has access to that content.

Open Platform

Papyrus provides an open platform for librarians, faculty and students to share and discuss library content. All posts are open to comments and all users are able to post content. No more having to deal with special roles, such as Librarians, being added to CTools courses by Faculty members.
